The Ape Exercise

This exercise was adapted from an exercise for composition classroom use. In the classroom, it could be used for team-building or to teach sentence combining, punctuation, conciseness, clarity, overall style, audience, medium, REVISION... In your personal Intensive Writing Experience (IWE), it offers a chance to play around with a sentence in order to make it as concise as possible. For scholarly writing, which often has word limits, this is an extremely useful skill.

Directions: The sentences below were taken from a news site. ¹ Use the steps given here to write a single sentence with the fewest number of words that still preserves the original meaning.

- 1. Combine all of the sentences into a single sentence. You may rearrange the order or delete words as necessary; however, the end result must preserve the meaning.
- 2. Count the number of words in your sentence. The original had 23 words. How does yours compare?
- 3. Revise the sentence to make it as concise as possible, while still preserving the meaning. How many words does the revision have? If you are doing this activity with a group, make it competitive. Who can come up with the shortest sentence that still preserves meaning?
- 4. Repeat step 3 until you can no longer revise without changing the meaning.
- 5. Take a few minutes to make a list of strategies you used in order to make a more concise sentence. For instance, did you remove redundant words? These are strategies you might apply in your scholarly writing as well. If you are working in a group, discuss the strategies. Which were familiar to everyone? Which were new to you?
- 6. If you plan to teach, consider how you might use this with your students.

Hundreds of people dressed up in gorilla outfits.

The apes are endangered.
