Intensive Writing Experience—Thesis & Dissertation Writers

Sponsored by the Purdue Writing Lab with support from the Purdue Graduate School

WHAT IS THE INTENSIVE WRITING EXPERIENCE (IWE)?

The purpose of the Intensive Writing Experience is to give masters and doctoral students in good standing with their programs time to write or to revise their thesis or dissertation with support from Writing Lab staff. Participants will receive writing instruction and support from Writing Lab staff, will spend significant time writing or revising their thesis or dissertation, and will network with other graduate writers on campus.

Summer 2024 offers one virtual week and three in-person weeks. Writers attend only one three-day session during the summer.

Virtual IWE

May 21-23

Virtual IWE will be a mix of synchronous and asynchronous sessions from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM (EDT) each of the three days in the session. Attendees are expected to be available during the entire time for the week they are attending.

In-person IWE

- May 14-16
- May 28-30
- June 4-6

In-person IWE will take place on campus in KRCH from 9:00 AM to 4:30 PM (EDT) each of the three days in the session. Attendees are expected to be available during the entire time for the week they are attending.

WHO CAN ATTEND THE INTENSIVE WRITING EXPERIENCE?

In order to participate, graduate students at the Purdue University West Lafayette campus must be in good standing with their academic program, must be writing or revising a thesis or dissertation, and **must have the approval of their major professor** or the director of graduate studies in their department.

Applicants will be asked to identify where they are in the writing process.

- Getting Started: The writer is just beginning to actually write the thesis or dissertation.
- Drafting: The writer is actively producing more text/material.
- Revising: A significant portion is already written, and the writer wishes to spend time improving the existing material.

Note that the IWE is **NOT** a formatting workshop. If you need help with formatting the document prior to deposit, please contact the <u>Graduate School Thesis & Dissertation Office</u>.

There is no guarantee that an applicant will be accepted to any session, as availability is based on staffing limitations.

For Virtual IWE: WHAT IF THE TIME ZONE DIFFERENCE DOES NOT ALLOW ME TO PARTICIPATE SYNCHRONOUSLY WITH EASTERN DAYLIGHT TIME?

If your time zone difference **does not allow you to participate in** the synchronous sessions, you should use the information available on the Purdue OWL to run <u>your own personal</u> <u>IWE</u>. You can also make <u>virtual appointments</u> with Writing Lab tutors if you need feedback.

HOW TO APPLY

The application process requires two submissions:

- 1. Writers should submit the application survey between Thursday, April 11, 2024, and Sunday, April 21, 2024.
- 2. When the application survey is submitted, the writer's advisor will automatically receive an email with a short list of questions to answer. The advisor should reply to that email by **Sunday**, **April 21**, **2024**. This email confirms that the major professor approves the graduate student's attendance at the event.
- Applicants will hear back from the Writing Lab about their acceptance the week of April 29th.
